Dr. Chesler was recently named to lead the new Eleanor Roosevelt Initiative on Women and Public Policy at Roosevelt House, Hunter College, The City University of New York. This program will pursue a wide agenda of research, publications, forums and applied public policy advocacy to advance the rights and needs of women and families in the United States and around the world. She is a former senior fellow at The Open Society Institute, the international foundation started by George Soros. From 1997 through 2006, she directed the foundation's \$35 million program in reproductive health and rights. She is the author of the award-winning *Women of Valor: Margaret Sanger and the Birth Control Movement in America* and is co-editor of *Where Human Rights Begin: Health, Sexuality, and Women in the New Millennium*.
