In this special presentation, Ms. Netter will describe her book, titled as above, which seeks to capture the character of one of the greatest illustrators in the history of medicine. The book tells his life story using her memories as well as Dr. Netter’s autobiographical notes, personal correspondence, private files, publications, public archives, and more than 100 interviews with family members, artists, distinguished practitioners and scientists.

Ms. Netter grew up on Long Island, where her father had a large art studio in the family home. She spent many hours with him there while he crafted his anatomical illustrations. She has a BA from North Carolina State University, an MA from Hofstra University and an MBA from the University of North Carolina. She has written about the history of medicine. She lives in North Carolina.
