Overview

Clinical Ethics: Debates, Decisions, Solutions Ethical challenges facing health professionals have never been more important or more numerous. This program emphasizes the theme of ethics and geriatrics, health emergency preparedness and other topics. From the role of ethics committees to controversies in public policy, it is clear that bioethics – and bioethics education – must be assigned the greatest possible roles in the daily lives of individual professionals and their institutions.

Course Objectives

Upon completion of this program, participants will:

- Discuss the role and importance of bioethics in clinical and institutional decision making, especially regarding aging, emergency preparedness, the role and function of ethics committees and other topics.
- Identify ethical challenges and issues in clinical practice, public policy, health law and the role of institutional ethics committees.
- Articulate ethically optimized solutions in clinical and public health contexts.

This course is designed for physicians, lawyers, nurses, social workers, clergy, psychologists, health administrators, philosophers and others with an interest or a need for continuing education in health ethics.
