Responsible researchers have obligations not only to "science," society and financial sponsors, but to each other. These obligations include reporting misconduct and protecting those who make such reports in good faith. Dr. O'Toole, repeatedly vindicated for her role in the now classic Baltimore Case, will review the facts of this important episode, identify the ways it represents a failure of scientific collegiality, and offer suggestions for appropriate ways to handle allegations of misconduct.

Dr. O'Toole is a researcher with The Genetics Institute and a former research fellow at the Massachusetts Institute of Technology.
